Gates

As many of you would now be aware, we are now locking our gates of a morning at 8.45am sharp.

This is to ensure that we comply with Child Safe standards and have full awareness and accountability for all our students from the start of the school day at 8.45am.

We understand that this has caused some frustration for some of our families who have been used to entering via the gates AFTER 8.45am, however this has resulted in rolls not being marked accurately as it is our policy that students arriving after this time as supposed to enter via the office to collect a late pass.

When late passes are given, the roll is updated to ensure accurate records are maintained.

At Yubup, we take the safety of all students incredibly seriously and this is another precaution our school is taking to maintain our high levels of child safety.

Students arriving to school after 8.45am when the gates are closed will need to enter the school via the office.

Lost Property

Don't forget to come and check lost property if your child has misplaced any clothing or personal items.

There are many jumpers with no name in the tub as well as other personal items.

If your child's property and uniform are named, they will be returned to them.

Focus on Our School Values: Courage

Courage has been selected as one of our core values at **Yubup Primary School** because it helps children persevere through challenges and, in doing so, builds their self-esteem.

At Yubup, courage means feeling supported to try something new, even when it's difficult, unfamiliar, or outside our comfort zone. It's about believing in ourselves and trusting the people around us.

Courage also means having the confidence to share our opinions and to respectfully stand up for what we believe is right—even when it's not the most popular choice.

Our message to students:

Be brave enough to try, even if you're unsure. Every time you have a go, speak up kindly, or face a challenge with persistence, you're showing courage. Remember—courage doesn't mean you're never scared; it means you keep going anyway!

Examples of Showing Courage at Yubup Primary

- Putting your hand up to answer a question, even if you're not sure of the answer
- Trying a new activity or sport for the first time
- •Asking a teacher or friend for help when you need it
- Standing up for someone who is being treated unfairly
- Admitting a mistake and learning from it
- Sharing your ideas or opinions in front of others
- •Including someone new in your group or game
- Staying calm and using strategies when you feel worried or frustrated
- Giving something another go after it didn't work out the first time

Students enjoyed sharing their favourite ways to move — from swimming, running, dancing to yoga and bike riding.




We discussed how exercise helps us stay strong, feel happy and have lots of energy for learning and play.

Students drew and labelled different emotions using chalk






PE TERM 4 SNAPSHOT




