Uniform Reminder

Our uniform policy requires student to wear our Yubup jacket or plain black jumper when at school. Jumpers and jackets that are not black should not be worn at school, unless a note has been supplied to the classroom teacher. As we continue focusing on our school expectations, it is important that all students wear our uniform with pride. I thank you for your support with this issue.

We love numbers in Foundation! We have been learning how to take smaller numbers away from larger numbers by playing dice games.










This term 4C have been amazing! They have shown curiosity throughout all their special days with enthusiasm and excitement!



After an exciting morning, our students completed a year level activity of creating cloud dough, making constellations, growing a Fibonacci garden and communicating in secret light codes.
















