Parent/Teacher Interviews – Thursday 27th November

Hats Blitz from Next Week

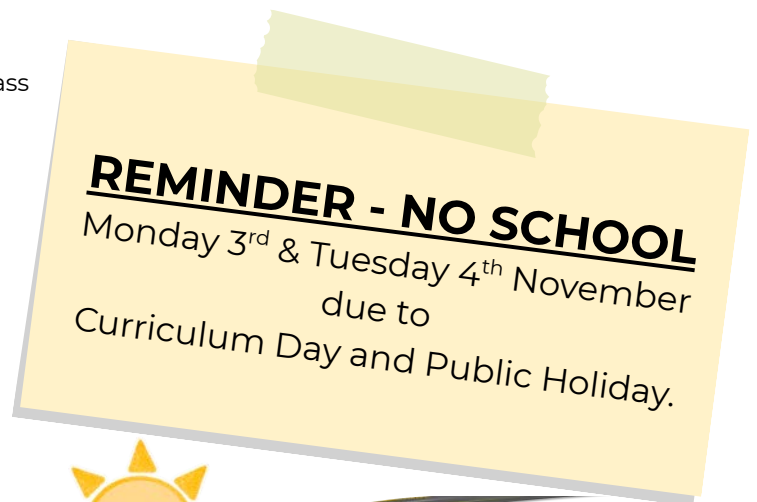

Wellbeing Focus: Managing Big Emotions After School

After a busy day of learning, socialising and trying their best, it's common for children to come home full of big emotions. Sometimes the calmest part of their day is at school — so when they get home to their safe space, all those feelings can spill out!

Here are a few gentle ways to support your child when the after-school emotions appear:

Pause Before Problem-Solving

Children often need to *decompress* before talking. Try offering a snack, some quiet time, or a run around outside before asking about their day.

Stay Calm and Steady

Your calm presence helps your child regulate. Instead of jumping into solutions, acknowledge their feelings:

"It sounds like you've had a really big day."

Offer a Way to Reset

Some children like to draw, others need movement, music, or a cuddle. Encourage them to choose what helps their body and mind feel calm again.

Keep Routines Predictable

A consistent after-school routine (snack → rest/play → homework → dinner) provides a sense of safety and reduces stress.

Remember: Big emotions are a normal part of learning to manage stress. With support and predictable routines, children develop strong coping skills that will serve them well into the future.

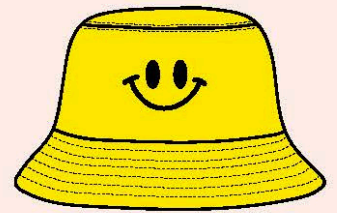

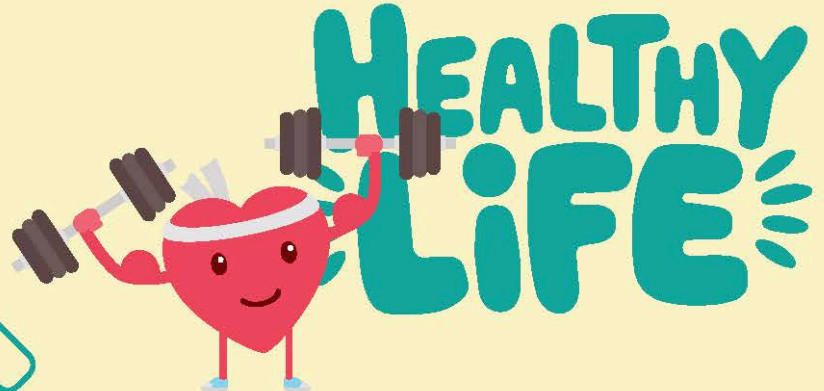
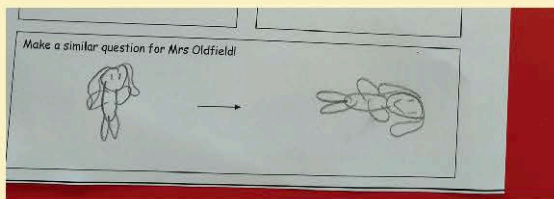
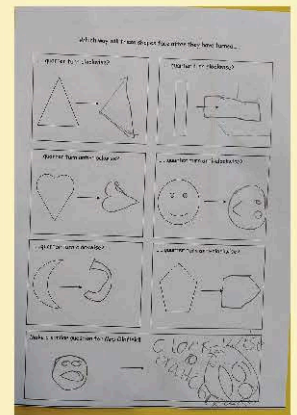
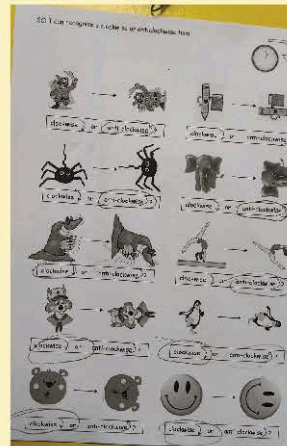
In math, we have been working on directions. We looked at whether an object has moved clockwise or anti-clockwise.



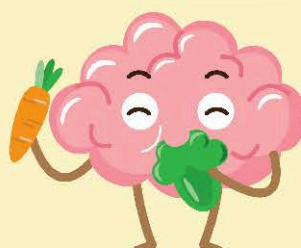
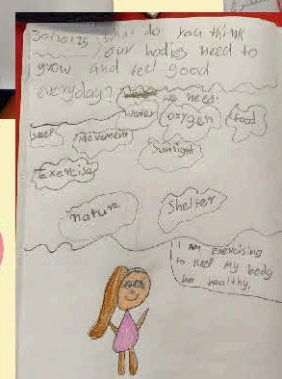
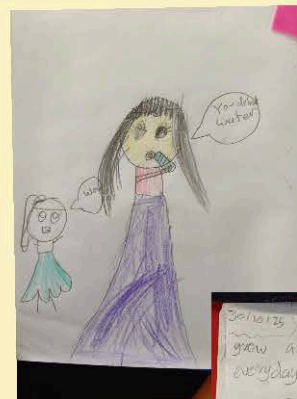
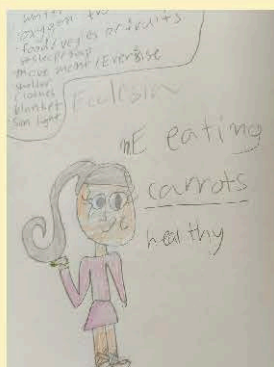

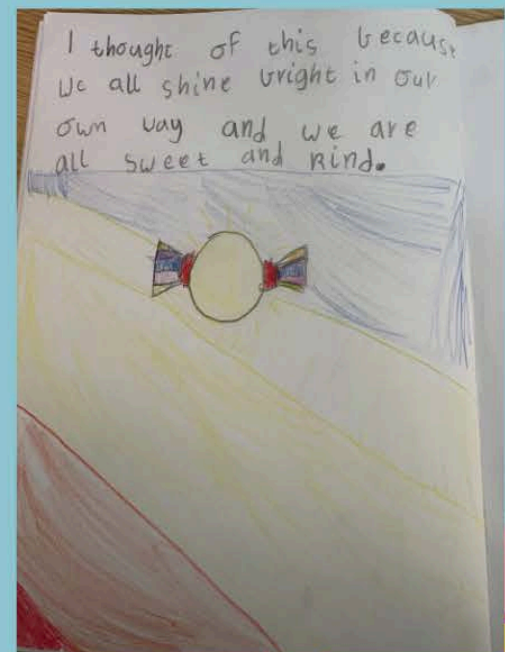
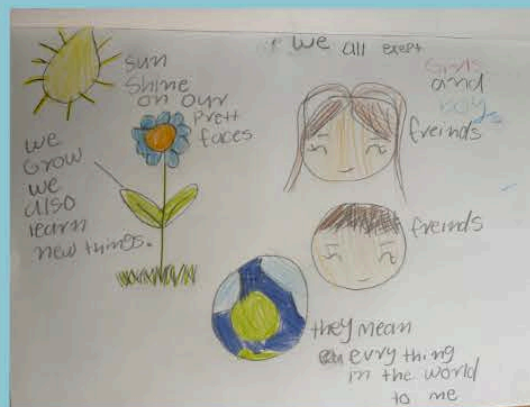
In inquiry, we have been investigating what our bodies need to keep us healthy. Students drew themselves doing an activity which keeps their bodies healthy.

In writing, we are exploring the magic of poetry! Students are expressing creativity through words and showing great progress in cursive writing, spelling, and handwriting.

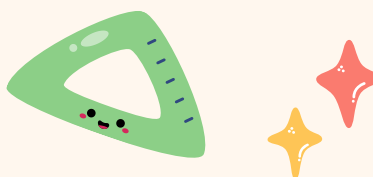
Inquiry
