- Child Safety Code of Conduct, which outlines acceptable and unacceptable behaviours for all staff and volunteers at our school.

Our students and families are important partners in providing a child safe environment. These regular newsletter reminders are one of the ways we ensure our school community is aware of:

- · our commitment to child safety, and
- how to provide feedback or raise child safety concerns.

#### **Working With Children Checks**

We have had a number of parents offering their time to attend our end of school celebrations with their child. Generally speaking, we try and send only school staff to these events however on occasion, we may ask for support from parents and caregivers.

Please be aware that all Parents, Carers and Community members are legally required to obtain a Working with Children Check for all child-related work, which includes volunteering in the classroom and when on excursions here at Yubup Primary School. If a person is engaging in child-related work, it is a legal requirement under the Worker Screening Act 2020 that they must, at a minimum, have a valid Working with Children Clearance unless an exemption applies (see below). Child-related work is defined in the Worker Screening Act 2020 as work that:

- involves an adult working with children under 18 years old (both paid and unpaid work)
- usually involves direct contact with a child or children, including physical, face-to-face, written, oral or electronic contact and
- the contact with the child or children is a usual part of the person's duties and is not occasional direct contact which is incidental to their work

An activity may be 'child-related work' regardless of whether the contact with a child is supervised by another person or not. This means even if a volunteer or visitor is supervised by a teacher, they must still have (and provide evidence of) a current Working with Children Clearance if they are performing 'child related work'.

Examples of child-related work activities are as follows:

- Attendant care
- School camps
- Excursions (including swimming)
- Literacy and numeracy support
- Homework clubs, breakfast clubs, lunch clubs, leadership or cultural workshops and other student support activities
- Distance education
- Work in an early childhood education and care service on school grounds (for example, kindergarten or playgroup. Reference: <a href="https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/suitability-checks/guidance">https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/suitability-checks/guidance</a>

Anyone coming into our school that will be undertaking any of the duties listed above will be asked to present a copy of their Working with Children Check upon signing into our school.

Please don't hesitate to speak to our wonderful office staff if you have any questions or require support in applying for a Working with Children Check.

#### <u>Parent/Teacher Interviews - Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> November</u>

Parent/Teacher interviews are now open on Compass and can be booked via the Compass app.

Interview bookings are available from 11am – 7pm.

On Parent/Teacher Interviews Day, students are only required to attend school for their scheduled interview time and do not attend school as usual on that day.

Focus on: Sleep and Why it Matters for our Kids!

## **Supporting Your Child's Sleep and Wellbeing**

A good night's sleep is one of the most important ingredients for your child's learning, behaviour, and overall wellbeing. When children are well-rested, they are calmer, more focused, and ready to engage in learning throughout the day.

## **Why Sleep Matters**

Research shows that children who get the recommended amount of sleep:

Concentrate and retain information more effectively

Regulate their emotions more easily

Have better physical health and immunity

Show improved social interactions and resilience

### **How Much Sleep Do Children Need?**

While every child is different, general guidelines recommend:

Ages 5–7: 10–12 hours per night Ages 8–12: 9–11 hours per night

### **Establishing a Calm Bedtime Routine**

Consistency is key! A predictable routine helps signal to your child's brain that it's time to wind down.

#### Try this simple **Bedtime Routine Framework**:

Wind Down: Reduce noise and screen time at least 60 minutes before bed.

**Connect:** Share a calm moment together – talk about the day, read a story, or listen to soft music.

Prepare: Encourage your child to get ready for bed in the same order each night (e.g. shower, pyjamas,

brush teeth).

Sleep Environment: Keep the room dark, quiet, and cool.

#### **Tips for Better Sleep Quality**

Avoid screens close to bedtime – blue light can delay sleep.

Encourage daytime physical activity and outdoor play.

Keep bedtime and wake-up times consistent, even on weekends.

Limit sugary foods or drinks before bed.

### **A Final Thought**

Helping children build strong sleep routines sets them up for success each day – supporting their mood, learning, and growth. A calm bedtime is one of the most powerful ways families can nurture wellbeing at home.

## Remember:



Let's all stay safe, SunSmart, and ready for fun!














## Numeracy








In math, our topic was measurement. The students have used their Geometry skills and have designed their own robots. The students then calculated the Area and Perimeter of each robot's parts.

















- Perimeter is the distance around a shape imagine tracing the outline of the robot's body with a piece of string and then measuring how long the string is.
- Area is the space inside a shape like figuring out how much aluminum you'd need to cover the robot's surface.

By exploring these ideas through creative robot designs, students saw how math helps us measure, build, and understand the world around us!
