Up an coming Social Media Ban

Social Media Age Ban - Key Information for Parents

A new law—the Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Bill 2024—makes it illegal for children under 16 to hold social media accounts on platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, X, and YouTube. The law will begin on 10 December 2025.

Why is this happening?

The ban aims to protect children from harmful content and online pressures while helping them build digital safety skills before turning 16.

Which platforms are included?

The full list is being finalised. Major social media platforms are expected to be covered, but messaging, gaming, health, and education platforms will be excluded.

What if my child already has an account?

Platforms must remove or deactivate accounts held by users under 16. Some accounts may be reactivated once your child turns 16, but not all platforms offer this option.

What can children still see?

Young people under 16 will continue to be able to view publicly available posts and videos (such as on YouTube, TikTok, and Facebook business pages) without signing in.

Enforcement

Social media companies must prevent under-16 users from opening new accounts and block workarounds. The eSafety Commissioner will ensure compliance, and fines may apply for violations.

Support and Resources

Talk with your child early about the changes and how this may impact their friendships and activities. Encourage alternative ways to connect, such as through messaging apps or joining clubs.



In writing, students are learning how to craft detailed recounts and present events in order. They are also creating an inquiry poster about a country of their choice, using research to support their ideas.


READING

In Inquiry, we are investigating Japan and learning how to take clear notes from different sources. Students are beginning to gather key information to support their final projects.












We are doing a deep dive into The Greatest Showman to learn more about inclusion and collaboration, helping to understand different features of a film to write a text response.







